

Liberal Votes by Judd Strom

Seven-year incumbent Judd Strom has consistently cast votes that do not align with our values. This flier highlights a small sample of many such votes.

In 2025, the Oklahoma Conservative Index ranked Strom at just 53% conservative. Out of 80 House Republicans, only three scored lower.

Seven years is long enough. If Strom wants to govern as a liberal — siding with the left on so many key votes — he should represent a district that shares those values, not House District 10, a deeply conservative district. We deserve a new leader — one who truly reflects our values through both words and votes.

HB 1835 Silencing Christian Counselors and Threatening Their Licenses

Strom voted for HB 1835, sponsored by a liberal Democrat from Tulsa. The bill aligned Oklahoma’s social worker licensing standards with national activist organizations promoting progressive ideology.

If Strom had his way, a Christian social worker — including those serving in our schools — who refused to embrace “gender-affirming” ideology or who provided counseling consistent with biblical teaching on sexuality could be branded “unethical” and face state discipline or even the loss of their professional license.

When woke ideology was at its peak and it mattered most, Strom did not stand up for Christian counselors — he voted to empower radical activists seeking to silence them.

Targeting people of faith and threatening their livelihoods for standing on biblical truth is the kind of abuse one would expect in a totalitarian society — not in deep-red Oklahoma.

SB 658 Opposing Protections for Faith-Based Foster & Adoptive Families

SB 658 sought to protect Christian and faith-based foster and adoptive parents from being punished or excluded by government bureaucrats for holding biblical beliefs about gender and sexuality.

The bill prevents DHS from denying or revoking foster or adoption eligibility simply because a parent refuses to affirm a child’s self-declared, non-biological gender identity. It stops the government from forcing families to abandon their moral or religious convictions as a condition of caring for vulnerable children.

This was a clear, common-sense conservative vote — protecting religious freedom, parental rights, and the ability of loving families to provide stable homes without being coerced by radical gender ideology.

Strom, along with three other liberal Republicans, joined liberal Democrats in opposing the measure. Fortunately, despite Strom’s opposition, the Legislature overwhelmingly approved, and it was signed into law in 2025.

HB 1712 **3.8 Million on Making Every Oklahoma Road Into a Toll Road**

Judd Strom voted for the “Road User Charge Pilot” — a scheme designed to turn every road into a toll road by using Orwellian technology to track every mile Oklahomans drive and then send them the bill.

Wasting almost four million in taxpayer dollars, spending \$12,880 per active pilot participant, the reckless spending alone is nearly as outrageous as the plan itself. But it gets worse. After the pilot ended, offshore gambling interests took over the program’s publicly promoted website — the same URL the state encouraged participants to use to communicate with government officials — creating serious security and privacy risks for Oklahomans who trusted the system.

In the end, taxpayers were left with nothing to show except wasted millions, compromised trust, and what became an epic Strom boondoggle.

HB 2147 **Allowing City Government to Foreclose on Private Property**

Breaking with long-standing protections that once kept city governments in check, Strom voted to allow cities to foreclose on and seize private property. His vote encourages local governments to target landowners through code enforcement — turning minor issues into a pretext to take private property.

Hiding the Cost of Illegal Aliens in Oklahoma Schools

Strom denied Oklahomans the right to know how many illegal aliens are enrolled in Oklahoma’s public school system. Taxpayers are footing the bill for this, and as the nation begins to see the tip of the illegal alien fraud iceberg, citizens have a right to know how much of their hard-earned money is being spent on individuals who are exploiting our laws for personal benefit.

The presence of illegal aliens in urban school districts is likely diverting education funding away from local and rural schools, rewarding urban districts that are financially incentivized to enroll and retain illegal alien students. This creates a perverse system that shifts resources away from Oklahoma families and communities.

By keeping these numbers hidden, Strom denied the public the ability to understand, evaluate, and hold government accountable for this abuse.

SB 511 **Green Lighting Needles to Drug Users**

Strom voted to authorize a program that distributes free drug paraphernalia for recreational use — dubbed “A Party in a Box.” He sent a reckless and dangerous message: illegal drug use is acceptable, and the government will help enable it. Instead of standing for recovery, accountability, and treatment, Strom backed a policy that keeps addicts trapped in dependency, normalizes destructive behavior, and undermines efforts to fight Oklahoma’s drug crisis.
